THE STUDENTS ARE ENROLLED IN THE RURAL ALASKA HONORS INSTITUTE. THE PROGRAM'S CONCEPT IS SIMPLE, ACCORDING TO COORDINATOR PAM HERMAN. IT IS TO FIND COLLEGE ORIENTED RURAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND BRING THEM TO THE CAMPUS FOR A SEVEN WEEK PREVIEW OF COLLEGE LIFE BETWEEN THEIR JUNIOR AND SENIOR YEARS.
