THIRTY SIX THOUSAND YEARS AGO, A BISON DIED. SATURDAY, APRIL TWENTY-EIGHTH, THE BISON WILL BE ON EXHIBIT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA MUSEUM.

THE BISON WAS FOUND COMPLETELY BURIED IN PERMAFROST A FEW YEARS AGO BY LOCAL GOLD MINERS. PERMAFROST PROTECTED THE REMAINS MAKING THE BISON ONE OF THE BEST PRESERVED PLEISTOCENE MAMMALS EVER FOUND.

THE FIND PROVIDED A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY FOR SCIENTISTS, ACCORDING TO MUSEUM TECHNICIAN GARY SELINGER (SELL en ger).

THE SCIENTISTS ARE STILL EVALUATING THE MATERIALS THEY FOUND. BUT MUSEUM VISITORS CAN ALREADY VIEW AND ENJOY THE BISON. THE ANIMAL WAS RECONSTRUCTED BY EIRIK (ERIC) GRANQVIST (GRAN kwist), A PROFESSIONAL MUSEUM TAXIDERMIST FROM FINLAND. THE RECONSTRUCTION ITSELF REQUIRED CONSIDERABLE SCIENTIFIC STUDY.
