

Consent and Release
Healy Lake Oral Histories

The Healy Lake Tribal Council working in cooperation with personnel from the National Park Service (NPS) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service have obtained funding from the Alaska Humanities Forum to obtain oral histories from elders from the community of Healy Lake.

This form is an agreement between you (as an interview respondent), the Healy Lake Tribal Council, the NPS, and the Alaska Humanities Forum.

You agree that your interviews may be recorded on audio tape, video tape, or computer files. Your interviews may be translated from Athabaskan into English, and written down in both Athabaskan and English.

You give NPS and the Alaska Humanities forum permission to publish transcripts or portions of transcripts of your interviews for scientific and educational purposes. Audio tapes, computer files, transcripts, and reports from the project will be kept on file and available to the public. The Alaska Humanities Forum and the NPS agree to provide you copies of transcriptions, translations, and summary reports before they are released to the public. The Healy Lake Tribal Council through funds provided by the Alaska Humanities Forum agrees to pay you for each interview.

You may specify other conditions. If you copyright your interviews, the NPS and the Alaska Humanities Forum will include a copyright notice on transcripts and on reports that include your transcripts. If you do not copyright your interviews, they may be published by other people without your permission. Copyright protection ordinarily lasts for the author's life plus 70 years. If you wish to specify any additional conditions, please check the appropriate space below:
