Dear Mr. Ream:

This letter regards the FY'81 summer field program to be conducted by BIA and NPS personnel in the Calista Region for the purpose of field examining regional 14(h)(1) selections. Calista Corporation appreciates the National Park Service's dedication to developing a thorough and effective program in spite of increasing budgetary and other constraints issuing from Washington, D.C.

First of all, you should be aware that approximately nine site selections in the Lime Village area and one hundred and fifty site selections in the Cape Romanzoff area were not forwarded to BIA by BLM and therefore are not included on your schedule this year. Calista Land & Resources Department is working to decipher why these applications have been omitted and to see that they are included on this or next year's schedule. We would appreciate any information you may have in your records as to the status of these sites as well as general information on the work which CPSU has completed thus far on sites within the Calista Region.

Calista Corporation's priority concern and firm understanding is that all proprietary and interpretive data generated by any BIA-NPS activity concerning Calista's 14(h)(1) selections ^{and of culturally significant sites} will remain confidential as the property solely of Calista Corporation. Such data includes all tapes and notes of interviews, field notes, photographs, specific and summary reports. No data of any kind generated by your activity is to be used in any professional or public reports except as absolutely necessary for BLM certification purposes. Furthermore, we understand that no archeological resources or artifacts will be disturbed in the field unless it is absolutely necessary for purposes of certifying the selection. Such resources can be re-



moved only with the understanding that they will always remain the property of Calista Corporation, that they will not be used for display or other public purposes and that they will be returned with their reports to Calista Corporation as soon as research is completed or within three years, whichever comes sooner.

You may wish to know the names of the landmen for the village corporations in the area where you will be working this summer. They are: Lawrence Kasayuli, Askinuk Corp.; Eugene Joseph, Sea Lion Corp.; Ignatius Chayalkun, Chevak Company; Janet Napoleon, Paimiut Corp.; and Jan Fredericks, Kuskokwim Corp.

Calista Corporation looks forward to further communications and activities with your office to assure the completion of a successful historical & cemetary sites program in the Calista region and the State of Alaska as a whole.
